FATHERS DAY MEMORIES

The topic of discussion for June was: What Coin or Numismatic Item Represents Fathers Day To You?

➤ Rosemarie talked about a special gold coin her

husband gave to her daughter, always reminding her of father's day

➤ Martha V thinks of the 1956 Lincoln cent, because that was the year she started looking through cents in change her father brought her.

➤ Charles J talks about the 1909-S VDB cent his son took a half day to purchase long ago. He didn't understand at the time how important a coin it was.

➤ Dan M's dad worked for Bethlehem Steel during World War 2, and had a strong box full of coins. His dad died in 1952, and when opening the box the coin that he remembers

most was a very worn 1892 Columbian Exposition coin. Merle interjected that although the mintage wasn't high (about 2 million), many were used regularly in circulation and quite worn.



- Steven H talked about his dad, who flew B-24s during WW 2 and commercial planes later. He carried a silver rupee with him all the time. He also talked about silver we used to be able to get from the government when redeeming silver certificates. Small amounts came in silver granules (which he showed), but larger amounts came in the form of silver bars which he also showed.
- Charley B tried to answer the question of why so few coins were minted in 1922. He brought up a lot of facts about events of the time. And he had written to Numismatic News to get more info. The nearly illegible written response was kindly translated by Mary Jo W (who must have either been a teacher or worked for a doctor, with her ability to read the scribbles). The response was: "Demand for coins in the U.S. fell dramatically after the W.W. I economic boom ended in the depression of 1920-1921. It ran Jan 1920 to July 1921 by the statistics, but these same statistics showed our recession ended in 2009 in June. Coin demand fell dramatically in our current recession and did so 90 years ago. The result was many coin denominations were in surplus and were not minted. The mint kept busy striking silver dollars. They were mandated by law requiring the replacement of the 270 million melted in 1918. It took until 1928 to replace the melted coins." and that, as they say, is the rest of the story.
- Liberty head nickels remind Charlie C of his dad. Among his first coins collected were a bunch his dad got for catching gophers on the Santa Barbara ranch he grew up on (5 cents each gopher caught). Charlie brought in an 1883 no cents V nickel purchased at our coin show several years. It came from the Louis Eliasberg collection, so it is nice to own a piece of that history. And it was a tapered planchet error, which piqued Lee G's interest as well.



- Glenn C's dad was born in 1919, so he collects 1919 coins.
- Anne N collects coins with turtles on them, reminding her of a turtle pond her dad used to have. She also collects coins with hummingbirds in his memory.

- Mike C's dad was born in 1938, so on his 50th birthday he gave his dad a 1938 Liberty Walking half dollar. He remembers searching through coins as a kid
- Merle's father used to love Portuguese bread. He has an Oakland token good for 1 loaf of bread at a Portuguese baker!
