The July meeting featured barbecue pork steaks and chicken, perfectly done by the gang at G & G Markets, thanks to Lee Gong for arranging it. There were also plenty of side dishes and delicious desserts brought in by members, thanks for everybody that pitched in—the food was great!

The flea market featured several members offering items for sale both before the meeting and during the dinner break. Other than 2 short talks, there was no other agenda item. So, much of the meeting was a fun social gathering to eat and get together with fellow collectors.

Steven H talked about a special metal detecting find of his. He was doing some under water detecting, and when scooping up a pile of sand, saw a gold chain dangling. He grabbed it, and found a Mexican 50 Peso gold coin in a gold bezel! The coin was in nice shape, too. That series was all dated 1821, the year of Mexican Independence, as well as the date of minting (1922). At the time of the meeting, the melt value of the coin, bezel, and chain was ~\$3400!

Steven also mentioned there are people who go to Hawaii for metal detecting under water as well. It is a lot of work, but 40-50 Tiffany rings

have been found to his knowledge, among other things.



Mike C told us how he has legally changed his last name to the original German spelling!

Finally, Mike M had a 1967 Canadian year set in a Capital Plastics holder. It had an unknown coin or medal in the center, pictured below and enlarged. It is the size of a US nickel.



It is a bronze coin commemorating the 100 year anniversary of the Canadian Confederation. Queen Victoria reigned at the beginning, and Queen Elizabeth reigned (and still does) at this anniversary. Canada issued "proof-like sets" that year, and one included a silver edition of this medal. There were other designs for the anniversary as well. Interestingly, it was very difficult to find any information at all on the internet.

Lady Liberty had a real bad hair day, and the eagle on the back looks more like a chicken struttin' its stuff. But I sure would love to own one. But samples like the one pictured above cost over \$100,000 at auction.

1500 of these were minted in silver in Philadelphia at John Harper's Cellar, Sixth and Cherry Streets- prior to completion of the first U.S. Mint. George Washington may have contributed some of the silver for minting them, and he even mentioned them in his November 6, 1792 National Address about needing small denomination coins. There is one known that was minted in copper. There were 3 silver and about 15 copper 1792 dimes; some silver centered and Birch cents; and even a few quarter dollars minted in 1792, all patterns. Ugly or not, it sure would be cool to own a little piece of history like this.

Speaking of ugly coins, an exhibit at the A.N.A. Museum in Colorado Springs is entitled The Faces of Money: The Good, The Bad, and The Ugly. It relates to coins portraying good people, bad people, and ugly portraits.
