CANADA'S "OTHER" OFFICIAL CURRENCY

Who is the jolly character on the currency shown above? Joe M gave a nice talk about what he called Canada's other official currency- from the Canadian Tire Corporation. Technically a form of scrip, it comes in denominations of 3, 5, 10, 25 and 50 cents, \$1, and \$2. There have been 21 different series of the 'money'. And the jolly man is named Sandy McTire.

In 1958 Canadian Tire "Money" was introduced, pioneering a loyalty program concept. It was conceived by the wife of the company founder. The coupons featured a happy tire and dollar sign running hand-in-hand, the Canadian Tire logo dating back to 1926, as seen on the 1962 note below.



Sandy McTire was introduced in 1961 and is still pictured today. The bills were (and presumably still are) printed on genuine bank note paper created by the British American Bank Note Company.

In 2000 the loyalty program was updated with a MasterCard that earned Canadian Tire "Money" anywhere MasterCard was accepted. In 2010 Canadian Tire "Money" launched a special series of coins (available with \$25 purchase, eh). They were produced by the Royal Canadian Mint and featured Canadian family winter moments on the reverse, and Sandy McTire on the obverse. The money is redeemable for merchandise at their stores.



Lest you assume this is all small potatoes stuff, here is a bit more interesting info from the corporation web-site and from Rich W.

- J.W. and A.J. Biles bought the Hamilton Tire and Garage Ltd in Toronto in 1922 for \$1,800.

- In 1937 one of their stores was the first retail store to equip their sales staff with roller skates, speeding up service
- In 1958, the first gas bar opens in Toronto. Gas customers received discount coupons, later known as Canadian Tire Money, redeemable in merchandise at Canadian Tire stores
- There were 40,000 cars on Canada's roads when the company was first purchased. There are now over 13.5 million cars.
- Canadian Tire expanded its territories in 1992 by opening three stores in Yukon and North West Territories. There are currently 750 stores.
- At the height of distribution, 9 million catalogs were distributed. Now 11.5 million flyers are viewed by 85% of Canadian households each week.
- 2 out of 3 Canadian men read their flyers each week, and more than 90% of the population lives within 15 miles of a Canadian Tire store.
- More than 80% of the population shops at a Canadian Tire store every year. Customers receive the currency as a fraction of their shopping bill at the check stand.
- Many small businesses across Canada accept the bills at face value. About one billion bills are in circulation across Canada, worth an estimated \$100million.
- Since its launch in 2005, Canadian Tire "Jumpstart" has helped give more than 400,000 Canadian kids a chance to play.
- The company is starting to phase out the bills in favor of a plastic card system.
- Collectors covet older bills, print newsletters, and have auctions. They also trade on Craig's List and other sites. Roger Fox is president of the Canadian Tire Coupon Collector's Club.

No wonder Joe M called the Canadian Tire money Canada's other currency.
