The April meeting of the Redwood Empire was simple—coins and food. No foolin'.

Edwin H talked about the Vallejo Coin Show coming up. And Merle talked about the national token show in Reno over Labor Day. And that was all the business we had.

MY CURRENT COLLECTION

- ↳ Rich W talked about upgrading his Type Set in between working on other collections. With a type set, it is often possible to gradually upgrade the quality of the coins, so this can be a never ending collection and lots of fun.
- ↳ David A is still looking for posters with coins, and working on his type set as well
- ↳ Carman B is working on a collection of Commemoratives, all MS 65 and above. He only needs about a dozen more to complete the set!
- ↳ Willie Q is building a set of holey Indian Cents. But they have to be old holes. So no more drilling your junky old coins and giving them to Willie. He also brought in his set of non-holey Indian cents, all XF-AU condition. Nice set.



↳ Charlie C brought a book on coins, which is about a legal case that was up before the U.S. Supreme Court in March. The book is a copy of a petition for a writ of Certiorari. It involves the Ancient Coin Collectors Guild (ACCG) working to preserve our right to import coins from countries (Cyprus, China, etc) blocked by a MOU (memorandum of understanding) agreed to under the US Executive branch. The agreements were meant to block historically significant items such as statues, architecture, etc from illegally being taken from the country of origin. But coins traveled extensively throughout the ages, so even if found in distant countries, they still would be banned from import to the US. No other country in the world has such ban, so they can be bought and sold and shipped anywhere but the US. There was some pretty shady dealing to get these memorandums approved without oversight, as well outlined in the book. Unfortunately the Supreme Court refused to hear the case (only 4 of 150 requests were granted that month). Prior U.S Circuit courts declined to do anything, so the ACCG will continue its efforts.

↳ Merle really, really, really likes 20 cent pieces. He just got another, this one being an 1878 graded Proof 61 by NGC. It goes well with his Proof 62, 63, and 64 coins (as well as the rarer 1877, his proof 65 20 cent piece). With mintages under 600, these are quite scarce. This is his coin pictured here





 Merle also talked about tokens. He was at a token convention the weekend prior to our meeting. There must have been over 50,000 tokens, plus 800+ at auction. Out of boredom he looked at one bulk lot and spotted a rarity. And for \$450 he bought the whole bunch of tokens, including the one he spotted—worth ~\$2000. It is one of only two known of this variety. It makes his 20 cent pieces look common. The token was from the Washington Hotel Bar in Petaluma, and the reverse is of the Jacob Strahle Billiard Manufacturer, from San Francisco. Strahle, an emigrant from Germany, was a fine craftsman who specialized in fine and rare woods in the manufacture of pool tables, balls, cues, etc. His company was advertised on many hotel/saloon tokens in the US. Strahle's work was so good his company was asked to manufacture the last railroad tie used for completing the transcontinental railroad. The Strahle tokens were only made from 1883 to 1891 and are very sought after.



 Lee G talked about an experimental pattern piece he owns, listed as Judd-2060. It was an experimental plastic piece, one of many pieces of various composition tried by the U.S.Mint while metal was scarce during WWII. Lee recently obtained a book on patterns and experimental pieces of WWII, which he found fascinating and hard to put down. He sent it in to be graded, only to find out there was graffiti scratched on the reverse of the plastic. It had a likely significance being a trial piece, but Lee is trying to find out what it is.



KIDS KORNER

Juniors that attended the April meeting got a special treat. Willie did a presentation on Indian Head Cents which was excellent. He began by showing us his first collection that he started when he was a junior. Then he explained that some of these first coins made it into his Dansco album which now holds the complete collection. He brought several Indian cents and invited the juniors to select one and "card it up".

NEW LECTURE SERIES


