HORSING AROUND

Horses were possibly the most prized animals in the ancient world, for their use in transportation, as beasts of burden, and in the military. They were also prized for their beauty, and were often depicted on ancient coins. One of the finest regions in ancient Greece for horses was Thessaly, and the Thessalian cavalry was admired throughout the Greek world. Even Alexander the Great's horse

(named Bucephalus, meaning "ox head") was from this region.

The most famous horse in Greek mythology (other than the wooden Trojan horse) was Skyphios, considered to be the first horse— born of the sea-god Poseidon and the earth. Rare early Greek coins depict the forepart of Skyphios emerging from the earth.

Many cities in the region of Thessaly featured horses on the reverse of the coins, with the most frequent being from Larissa. They must have been proud of their

horses there, because nearly all issues of coins featured horses. And they showed horses in several actions, including grazing, preparing to roll, or prancing. The obverse of the coins feature the nymph Larissa, which the city was named for. The portraits on both sides are usually in high relief with excellent detail. They stopped being minted late in the 4th century BC due to the domination of Macedonian Kingdom under Kings Philip II and Alexander III "the Great". But fortu-

nately they are relatively common and affordable for those who like to collect nice samples of ancient numismatic artwork.
