#### **ELECTION OF OFFICERS**



#### WHAT IS IT?

Well, this doesn't qualify as my "Best Numismatic Item" of 2018, but it sure is the strangest. This tiny (1/4") coin from about 350 BC was made by the Philistines, on the western edge of what is now Israel. On one side was an owl, imitating the Greek coins of Athens. But the obverse here features the bearded head of a man facing to the right, and his cap is a dog facing to the left! It may have its jaws open, or they may be closed- depending on how you look at it. There were two other coins struck in that era that looked like a man from one angle, and a lion when rotated to another angle. The meaning of these symbols remains unclear.
