
Finally, we will have nomination and election of officers of the club. Each officer serves a one year term. Any adult club member is welcome to run for office or nominate somebody.

SHOW & TELL: COINS WE ARE THANKFUL FOR

- ⇒ Phil A recently purchased a 2019 U.S. Mint Pride of Two Nations set. It features a U.S. Silver eagle and a Canadian silver Maple Leaf coin, both with modified proof finishes.
- ⇒ Guy S has some coin dealers who like wine. He is thankful that they trade him ancient coins for his wines!
- ⇒ John B collects beer cans, among other things. He recently traded an apparently valuable can for two one-ounce gold American eagle coins!
- ⇒ Helmut is thankful for a recent search of a parking lot he had ignored for quite some time. He found a 1908-S Barber dime and a 1929-S Standing Liberty quarter!
- ⇒ Charlie C showed a ~3" medal issued by the Paris Mint in 2006. It was a restrike of the one issued in 1906 in sympathy and support of the people of San Francisco following the 1906 earthquake. Some of the city ruins are featured on the obverse design. The medal was purchased in 2006, but lost in the 2017 Tubbs Fire. It was one of the first things to be replaced, as it symbolized the spirit and resilience of San Francisco after the earthquake, as well as same spirit of Santa Rosa's recovery. That medal is now on display in my newly rebuilt Coffee Park home (just moved in a week ago!). I am thankful to the club as well, for the friendship and support that helped me through a couple of tough years.



⇒ Ember S did not have a coin story, but she did have a good suggestion for all of us that lost and will lose power in the PG&E grid shutdowns. How to tell if the food in the freezer thawed and is bad after

power is lost? This was learned in the mid-West, where freezing winters often knock out power. Of course, there they can just put the food outdoors to stay frozen until power is back on, something we cannot do here. Take a plastic or glass jar at least 4" tall, fill with 4" of water and freeze it. Then lay a cent on top, cover, and keep it in the freezer. If power is lost, the ice in the jar will start to melt as the freezer thaws. As long as the cent is at least 1" up from the bottom, food should be good. If the cent is lower than 1" or on the bottom of the jar, the entire freezer is thawed, and food will be no good.


