## SANTA

As he does each year, Santa Merle handed out presents to each and every one of the seventy members who were at the meeting. Many thanks to his wife Dena who beautifully wrapped each one. Even Gary C, who attended via Zoom, got one- he was able to see the assortment and make a choice.


## TALKS

- Guy S discussed how the stories of St. Nicholas date to around 1500. He recently acquired this 1500 dated coin at auction. It features St. Rupert holding a salt bucket. He was the first Bishop of Salzburg, where salt was a primary source of income, around the year 700 AD. Salt at that time was a very valuable commodity. Guy also shared a couple receipts for coins he bought about fifty years ago. One was for a 1794 half cent for $\$ 40$ (now worth $\$ 700$ ); an 1806 half cent in F-VF condition for $\$ 22.50$; and an 1806/5 half dollar in F condition for $\$ 69$, and 1929 BU Buffalo nickel for $\$ 9$ !
- Rich W just joined the ANA and was reading the monthly ANA magazine The Numismatist. He talked about an article featuring a 1-ounce, 0.999 -fine 2012 gold piece with a denomination of 1,000 Bitcoins (BTC) that was purchased in 2011 for $\$ 4905$. The Bitcoin community refers to it as the "Gold Cas", a reference to the Casascius brand of BTC coins produced from 2011-2013. The anonymous owner had this piece graded (accompanied by armed
 guards) by PCGS as PR-70 DCAM. But it is not for sale- it resides in a vault overseas. Six of its kind were made, and four have not yet been redeemed for their dollar value, including this example. Each has a current market value of approximately $\sim \$ 50$ million at the time this is being written. A month ago, it was worth $\sim \$ 65$ million.

- Phil A is fond of ancient Roman coins. In case you did not hear his talk at the meeting, he mentioned reading a book on gladiators that mentioned Emperor Commodus. So, he looked in his collection and sure enough he had a silver denarius with his portrait. Emperor Commodus ruled jointly with his father Marcus Aurelius from 176-180 AD, then as sole emperor until his death at age 31 in 192 AD. He is known for participating in gladiator fights, and the movie "Gladiator" is about one seeking revenge on Commodus. In real life Commodus fought against professional gladiators and wild beasts. He defeated all his opponents easily, but only wounded them since they all submitted to him (only because he was emperor, not because he was truly a gladiator). I did not get a picture of Phil's coin, though it was a very nice one. This is an image of one from the internet

- Bob L claims that when he passes a thrift store his car tends to swerve over to the right, so he has to stop. He recently stopped by one that had an 1882 CC Morgan Dollar in a GSA holder. It had proof-like surfaces, and only cost \$220. He is submitting it to PCGS for grading. If it does come back with a proof-like designation it will be worth twice what he paid!
