Catcher in the rai? I don't think so. Rai is the term for money on the island of Yap, in Micronesia. This ain't no pocket change, though. Yap money is made of limestone— big circular chunks of limestone with a hole in the center for carrying on a pole.

It originated several hundred years ago when Yapese fishermen were blown of course in a storm and landed in Palau— 250 miles away. They broke off a piece of limestone and did a bit of carving on it with shell tools. They brought home a stone that was shaped like a whale, which is called "rai" in Yapese and that is where the word comes from.

Being isolated on one island, people on Yap found value in something being brought from far away that could be used as a form of monetary exchange. So they started making trips to Palau, bringing back sometimes huge stones which were now moon shaped with the hole for transportation.

The value was determined by how many people were lost in the journey to bring a stone home; the craftsmanship (earlier pieces shaped by shell tools are more valuable than more modern ones formed with modern tools); if it was dedicated to the chief who sponsored the trip to Palau; and somewhat by size, though in some cases a small stone can be more valuable than a large one.

The stones did not do a lot of traveling. They tended to stay at the village of the owners, or in the public dancing or ritual ground of a tribe. And if there is an 'exchange', the stone usually stayed in place, even if the new owner tribe lived far away.

Some people have sold stones to the outside world, usually done by younger tribe members. But there is such pride in the stones and cultural importance, that they mostly remain where they have been for hundreds of years.

On second thought, I really don't care to have one. Besides what it may cost to purchase, imagine the shipping cost! I'll stick to coins.
