- ◆ Membership dues for 2012 can be paid at the meeting, please see Treasurer Mike C up at the front of the room.



KIDS KORNER

At the November meeting we discussed state quarter questions from October as follows:

1. Why the tree on Connecticut? Ans: In 1687, a British representative of Kings James II challenged Connecticut's government and demanded the state's charter. Capt. Joseph Wadsworth hid the charter in the hollow of a tree which became known as 'The Charter Oak'
2. Why the airplane on North Carolina? Ans: The plane is called the Flyer. It was the first successful flight of a heavier-than-air, self-propelled flying machine. The flight took place in 1903 at Kitty Hawk, North Carolina.
3. Why the arch on Missouri? Ans: The arch in St Louis represents the gateway to the west. The 8000 mile journey by Lewis and Clark from St Louis to the west and back. The journey started from St Charles in 1804 and ended in St Louis in 1806. The boat under the arch are Louis and Clark returning to St Louis after their journey. Why the spike on Utah? Ans: The spike joined the Union Pacific and Central Pacific railroads to complete the transcontinental route in Utah in 1869.
