

### The United States Mint Philadelphia

It had been over 40 years since my last visit. Memories of the then-new U.S Mint building are still vague, but the tour was not even complete at the time. There was no way I would miss seeing the mint while in Philadelphia recently, and the visit was well worth it.

Philadelphia is a great place for kids to grow up. The Liberty Bell, Independence Hall, and a number of historical places all are located within one section of the city. It was good seeing school trips with lots of excited kids visiting the mint and other sites.





One of the first things you notice after passing through security and entering the spacious building, are seven murals designed by Louis Tiffany. Two rectangular mosaics are 14' wide, and five circular ones are 5' wide. They illustrate the ancient Roman minting process. They use figures of children as workers, and the design is patterned after similar murals unearthed in Pompey featuring plump winged cupids doing the work.

An long escalator ride up takes you to a small museum with some historic coin, medal, and equipment displays. Then you walk down a hallway the length of the entire building and back. There are nice displays describing the entire process from designing coins and medals, transferring them to hubs and dies, producing and finishing the planchets, and the entire coining, counting, and distribution process. You view the minting process through large windows, looking down from 40' above the factory floor.

The pictures here are all available on the web— I did not dare sneak a photo while in the building. The process of making the models, hubs and dies was clearly described with good examples to look at. The shops where that was done could be viewed, though there was little activity on the day of my tour.

Minting was quite active though, starting with the rolls to make the planchets. Everything but cent planchets are made on site, and huge racks of 6000 pound metal coils could be seen, pictured here.



Planchets ended up in huge bins, and there were conveyor belts taking everything to different stages of the minting process.



Planchets went through annealing to heat them up and soften them for easier pressing, seen in this photo. Then they were washed, dried, and an edge rolled onto them.



Finally, they were transferred to rows of minting machines like the one in the photo above. Afterward they go into huge bins, where they are taken to be put in bags for distribution. The bags are about 2' cubes, and the coins are counted by weight, not by the exact number.

There was a separate section where we even watched special medals being produced and packaged individually, with workers wearing white gloves. If you ever get to Philadelphia, this is a tour you should not miss. And it is free!
